Outings: At various times, Braid Society members get together to visit places of special interest as a group. Details of upcoming outings appear in the newsletter.

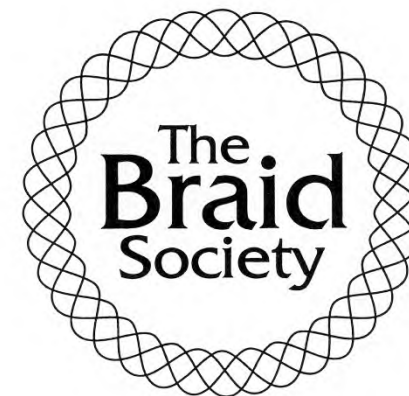

Long-Haul membership is available to residents of Asia, the Americas, Africa, Australia and New Zealand. Long-Haul members are mailed a hard copy of *Strands*; all other communication is by e-mail. They have no voting rights and pay non-member entry fees to Society events. Long-Haul membership does not include participation in the swap or exhibitions. An upgrade to Full membership can be made at any time.
